Hydrant Flushing

The Tipp City Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants Monday, May 12, 2014, through Friday, May 23, 2014, during the hours of 7:30 am to 3:30 pm. The following schedule will be followed.

- **Monday, May 12, (Main Street South)** all hydrants from South First Street to Hathaway, including the Roslyn area.
- **Tuesday, May 13, (Main Street North)** all hydrants starting at North First Street to Bowman Avenue.
- **Wednesday, May 14 and Thursday, May 15 (South West area)** Tipp Plaza areas, Hathaway, Spring Hill, Willow Glen, Cottonwood, Hampton Woods, Hunters Ridge, York Meadows and Sycamore Woods.
- **Friday, May 16,** will be used as a makeup day if needed.
- **Monday, May 19 and Tuesday, May 20, (North West area)** all hydrants starting at Westedge, Tippecanoe Village, Manchester Chase, North Tipp-Cowlesville Rd, Tweed Woods, Commerce Park Drive, Weller Dr and Curry Branch.
- **Wednesday, May 21 and Thursday, May 22, (North West area)** all hydrants starting on County Road 25-A, Spring Meade, Woodlawn, Donn Davis Way, Windmere, Oakwinds and Rosewood Creek.
- **Friday, May 23,** will be used as a makeup day if needed.

Water in these areas may be discolored. Residents are advised to avoid using laundry or hot water facilities during the flushing period. If residents find their water to be discolored, they should run cold water for 5 to 10 minutes until the water clears. Although the water will not be turned off, a drop in pressure in some areas is likely.

Flushing hydrants is a preventive maintenance program to periodically clean out natural residues which deposit in the water lines, as well as to test the hydrants. •

Life Line Screening Community Health Event

On Friday, June 20, 2014, Premier Health will be sponsoring a Life Line Screening preventive health event at the **Tipp City Government Building**, 260 S. Garber Dr. Tipp City. Five vascular/ultrasound screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to; blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for both men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening from \$149 (\$139 with member discount). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. Finger stick blood testing will also be available for cholesterol, diabetes, thyroid, and more. Individual screenings are \$55-\$70 each. Tipp City Veterans' Memorial Pavers

The tan bricks are available in two sizes: 4" x 8" - 3 lines of print (\$53.25) and the 8" x 8" - 6 lines of print (\$213.00). Applicant/honoree must have a connection to Tipp City/Monroe Township. Checks are to be made payable to the City of Tipp City and received by September 5, 2014.

Reminder...City residents have a new way to dispose of yard waste at no cost. The City has entered into an agreement with BR Mulch, 620 Ginghamburg Road, to accept City residents' yard waste at no cost to the resident. BR Mulch will accept yard waste in the form of branches, brush and trees (smaller than 12" inches in diameter). No leaves, stumps or root balls will be accepted.
