Working and non-working items accepted include computers, monitors, cell phones, hard drives, printers, toner cartridges, keyboards, mice, speakers, cords/cables, software, routers/switches, fire walls, servers and scanners. We will be unable to accept TVs at this year's event. Receipts for tax purposes will be provided to those who donate.

2014 Paving Program Is Underway

The 2014 paving program is currently underway. Streets in the 2014 repaving program include Charrington Way, Pinehurst, Stone Ridge Court, Larch, Sequoia, Banyon Tree Way and Chestnut. Many thanks to the successful CIP Levy in 2010.

Work will also begin on CR25A (from Donn Davis Way to Commerce Park) and West Kessler-Cowlesville Road (from CR25A to the Western



corporate limit). This project is being funded by ODOT/MVRPC Grant, OPWC Grant, the Miami County Engineer and Miami Township Trustees. Replacing all signage and installing new fire hydrants are also included in the scope of this project. •

Tipp City Leaf Pickup Schedule for 2014

The Tipp City Street Dept. will be starting the leaf pickup program soon.

There are a few important guidelines to follow. Residents are asked to rake leaves into the street, 1 foot from the curb, so that storm water will drain. **Please, NO limbs, sticks, bricks, rocks or yard debris should be placed with the leaves in the street.** These items cause damage to the equipment, create down time for repairs, and add delay to the leaf pickup schedule.

Hydrant Flushing

The Tipp City Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants Monday, September 29, 2014 through Friday, October 10, 2014, during the hours of 7:30 am to 3:30 pm. The following schedule will be followed.

- **Mon., Sept. 29**, (Main Street South) all hydrants from South First St to Hathaway, including the Roslyn area.
- **Tues., Sept. 30**, (Main Street North) all hydrants starting at North First St to Bowman Ave.
- **Wed., Oct. 1 and Thurs., Oct. 3** (South West area) Tipp Plaza areas, Hathaway, Spring Hill, Willow Glen, Cottonwood, Hampton Woods, Hunters Ridge, York Meadows and Sycamore Woods.
- **Thurs., Oct. 2**, along Evanston Rd, and S. County Rd 25-A south of Evanston Rd going to Corner Stone Dr.
- **Mon., Oct. 6 and Tues., Oct. 7**, (North West area) all hydrants starting at Westedge, Tippecanoe Village, Manchester

Chase, North Tipp-Cowlesville Rd, Tweed Woods, Commerce Park Dr, Weller Dr and Curry Branch.

- **Wed., Oct. 8 and Thurs., Oct. 9**, (North West area) all hydrants starting on County Rd 25-A, Spring Meade, Woodlawn, Donn-Davis Way, Windmere, Oakwinds and Rosewood Creek.
- **Fri., Oct. 10**, will be used as a make-up day if needed.

Water in these areas may be discolored. Residents are advised to avoid using laundry or hot water facilities during the flushing period. If residents find their water to be discolored, they should run cold water for 5 to 10 minutes until the water clears. Although the water will not be turned off, a drop in pressure in some areas is likely.

Flushing hydrants is a preventive maintenance program to periodically clean out natural residues which deposit in the water lines, as well as to test the fire hydrants.
