**WATER BOIL ADVISORY**

RE: **Water Boil Advisory**

Date: June 22, 2015

The Tipp City Water Department experienced a water main pressure drop below 20 pounds per square inch due to a water leak on Shirley Drive that affected your residence. According to OEPA regulations, we are required to issue a boil advisory any time the City's water pressure drops below 20 PSI. In addition, we are required to test the water in the affected area for bacteriological contaminants.

**Any water intended for consumption/cooking purposes should be boiled vigorously for 5 minutes.**

This is a precautionary measure utilized until the Tipp City Water Department receives notice from the testing laboratory that the water in the affected area is safe to drink.

The normal time frame for the laboratory to complete bacteriological testing is 24 hours.

When the boil advisory has been lifted, there will be another notice posted on your door advising you that the water is safe to drink and you no longer have to boil the water intended for consumption.
