Quarterly Withholding Due Dates Have Changed


Businesses that withhold and remit Tipp City income tax on a quarterly basis need to be aware that the due dates for these returns and payments have changed. Senate Bill 172 (SB 172) was signed by Governor Kasich on June 14, 2016 and became law 90 days later on September 12, 2016. Quarterly withholding returns and payments are now due by the last day of the month following the last day of the calendar quarter. 
Tax Facts - Did You Know???

The Tipp City income tax code requires all Tipp City residents age 18 and older to file an annual income tax return. Residents who are 16 or 17 years of age are also required to file if their income is not subject to Tipp City tax withholding by their employer, or if their income is subject to a municipal income tax at a rate less than 1.5 percent. Tipp City residents who are retired, permanently disabled, or have any other form of disability that keeps them from working, can be exempted from filing the annual return by completing a Certification Form. Tipp City Leaf Pickup Schedule for 2016

The Tipp City Street Dept. will be starting the leaf pickup program soon. There are a few important guidelines to follow. Residents are asked to rake leaves into the street, 1 foot from the curb, so that storm water will drain. **Please, NO limbs, sticks, bricks, rocks or yard debris should be placed with the leaves in the street.** These items cause damage to the equipment, create down time for repairs, and add delay to the leaf pickup schedule.

Oct. 17 – Oct. 21 and Nov. 14 – Nov. 18

Areas throughout the City as needed. Areas between I-75 and N. Hyatt St. (north of W. Main St.) *No pickup on Veterans' Day, Nov. 11.*

Oct. 24 – Oct. 28 and Nov. 21 – Nov. 25

All areas East of Hyatt St. (north and south of Main St.) *No pickup on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 24.*

Oct. 31 – Nov. 4 and Nov. 28 – Dec. 2

Areas between I-75 and S. Hyatt St. (south of W. Main St.)

Nov. 7 – Nov. 11 and Dec. 5 – Dec. 9

Areas West of I-75 (north and south of Main St.)

Dec. 12 – Dec. 16

Clean up throughout the City as needed •

Your Pavement and Storm Water Runoff

Conventional pavements create hard, impervious surfaces that prevent rain from naturally soaking into the ground, creating storm water runoff. This water can pick up and float pollutants such as trash, gas, oil, salt and fertilizer from streets, sidewalks and lawns down to the stream – untreated.

Pervious (or porous) pavements are designed to allow the rain to drain through and filter down into the layers beneath, instead of forcing the rain to travel to the storm drain, picking up pollutants as it makes it way back to the water table. •
