As members, neighbors, and visitors of our community, you may have noticed signage indicating “Blasting Area Ahead” on I-75, at the 70-mile marker, and in the Windmere neighborhood.

As early as Monday, August 4th, 2025 construction blasting will begin at the Summit Landing by Arbor Homes residential development, located at 3401 Peters Road. Blasting will occur as much as two times daily and is scheduled to last between 6-8 weeks, weather dependent. Blasting is restricted to daytime hours only.

HTA Enterprises Inc. is the subcontractors that will be conducting the blasting for excavation of the shallow rock bed. The firm is licensed, insured, and has more than 40 years of experience. The project is regulated and permits are issued through various local, state, and federal agencies, including: Tipp City Emergency Services, Ohio State Fire Marshal’s Office, Regional Air Pollution Control Agency (RAPCA), and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF).

HTA Enterprises Inc. has contracted with Kentuckiana Seismic & Survey Inc. to offer pre-blast surveys to residents and business owners within a defined radius of the worksite.

HTA Enterprises Inc. will be providing daily blast activity updates, with 24-hour notice, to the following agencies: Tipp City Emergency Services, Tipp City Police Department, Tipp City Administrative Staff, Miami County Sheriff’s Office, Miami County Communications Center, Miami County Hazmat Team, Miami County Emergency Management Agency/ Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), Ohio State Highway Patrol – Piqua Post, and Ohio Department of Transportation.

We anticipate the blasting excavation work to cause only minor disruptions. Due to the hazardous nature of explosive materials, we are asking everyone to keep clear of this worksite over the next 8 weeks and throughout the balance of construction. Children have been observed riding bikes and playing on dirt piles in the evenings at the site. Construction worksites present a variety of hazards. Please join us as a partner in safety.
