Tipp City Electric Sends Mutual Aid to Homestead, Florida

Tipp City Electric has been assisting the City of Homestead Florida with power restoration after Hurricane Irma made landfall on September 9. Tipp City Electric crews began restoration work on September 13 and plan to stay in Homestead until September 26. As part of this effort, Tipp City sent four linemen and three trucks to assist. During this time Tipp City has been receiving many comments from Homestead residents on our social media pages. One Florida resident said "Thank you Tipp City for sending your crews down here to help us. I met some of them today as they fixed two broken light posts behind my house and helped restore power to our neighborhood. After 4 days and night of no power we can sleep comfortably tonight with air conditioning thanks to you guys. I am truly grateful for your help!" ●



Tipp City Leaf Pickup Schedule for 2017

The Tipp City Street Dept. will be starting the leaf pickup program soon. There are a few important guidelines to follow. Residents are asked to rake leaves into the street, one foot from the curb, so that storm water will drain. Please, **NO limbs, sticks, bricks, rocks or yard debris should be placed with the leaves in the street.** These items cause damage to the equipment, create down time for repairs, and add delay to the leaf pickup schedule.



Message from City Manager Eggleston

In 2006, the Tipp Schools entered into an agreement with the City of Tipp City to oversee the stadium. The last major update to the stadium was over 20 years ago. The stadium is outdated and does not meet current safety standards. This poses numerous problems, one of which is safety of those using the facility, whether as a participant or spectator. A group of citizens came together known as Tipp Pride in an effort to reach out to the community to raise funds to build a new stadium. Tipp Pride is a 501(c)3 organization, which means your contribution, is tax deductible. The stadium is a joint project between the City and the Schools as the City owns the property and the two entities share the restroom facility. Upgrades include a building that will house the restrooms (which will be heated for winter events and use), concession stand, storage, ticket booths and spirit store. The current stands accommodates approximately 1,800 spectators. The new grand stands will be increased to seat 2,100 spectators. The press box will be updated to allow cameras to be mounted and to better provide separation between coaching staff. One of the major changes is to provide concessions and restrooms on the visitor side. You can learn more by going to the Tipp Pride website: www.tipppride.com for additional information. This will continue to be a community facility and the City and Schools will prepare a schedule of events, which will include the Mum Festival, marching band competitions, and Fourth of July events. The City is appreciative of Tipp Schools for keeping this facility in City Park. ●

Tax Facts – Did You Know???

The Tipp City income tax code requires all Tipp City residents age 18 and older to file an annual income tax return. Residents who are 16 or 17 years of age are also required to file if their income is not subject to Tipp City tax withholding by their employer, or if their income is subject to a municipal income tax at a rate less than 1.5 percent. Tipp City residents who are retired, permanently disabled, or have any other form of disability that keeps them from working, can be exempted from filing the annual return by completing a Certification Form.
